London Policing College (LPC) continues to evolve as an international provider of specialist policing, security, and intelligence training. As part of this evolution, it is important that all associates have a clear and consistent understanding of who we are, what we deliver, and how we operate. At our core, LPC exists to build professional capability that delivers real operational impact. We combine practitioner expertise, operational credibility, and modern learning approaches to deliver programmes that directly improve performance in complex and demanding environments.

The strength, credibility, and impact of our work is built on your collective expertise, professionalism, and real-world experience. Our programmes are not off-the-shelf; they are bespoke, designed in collaboration with each client to meet specific organisational needs and challenges. We integrate cutting-edge technology, including immersive learning environments and virtual reality, to create highly interactive experiences that go beyond traditional training. This enables participants to engage in realistic scenarios, strengthen decision-making under pressure, and apply learning in a way that is immediately relevant. What sets LPC apart is the combination of practitioner-led delivery, tailored programme design, and a relentless focus on real-world impact. We work alongside our partners to build capability, enhance performance, and deliver outcomes that are both measurable and sustainable.

Our international work demonstrates LPC at its best. Through partnerships with organisations such as the Hellenic Police, we design and deliver specialist programmes that strengthen analytical capability, support operational decision-making, and develop professionals equipped to meet modern policing challenges. These programmes ensure participants can think critically, apply structured analytical techniques, and operate confidently in complex environments.

LPC continues to deliver advanced international programmes designed to meet evolving global threats. A current example is the Advanced Counter-Terrorism Investigation Programme being delivered in Greece. This intensive programme strengthens the forensic and investigative capabilities of experienced counter-terrorism officers, equipping them to respond to terrorist incidents with technical expertise, strategic thinking, ethical judgement, and effective collaboration. Through immersive simulations, participants develop the ability to manage



complex crime scenes, lead intelligence-led investigations, make critical decisions under pressure, and deliver robust, evidence-based outcomes. Supported by highly experienced practitioners, this work reinforces LPC's role in advancing capability and strengthening international collaboration.

We also deliver a range of specialist programmes, including the Certified Counter Terrorism Practitioners Course (CCTP). These courses provide practical, actionable knowledge that professionals can immediately apply in their roles, covering areas such as threat assessment, intelligence-led planning, detection of hostile activity, strategy development, and incident response. The focus remains firmly on operational relevance and real-world application, with participants consistently reporting improved confidence, decision-making, and organisational resilience.

A key strength of LPC is our commitment to immersive and experiential learning. Through partnerships with organisations such as the University of West London, we utilise realistic environments, including mock courtrooms, to deliver hands-on training. Participants engage in role-based scenarios that bring learning to life, supported by experienced practitioners who connect theory directly to practice. We continue to enhance this through innovative methods, including immersive technologies, ensuring our delivery remains engaging, relevant, and forward-looking. International engagement further reinforces that learning is always a shared process, benefiting both LPC and our global partners.

Alongside our international work, LPC continues to deliver impactful programmes across the UK. In Sutton, we successfully completed Year 1 of the Emergency Planning Training and Exercise Programme for the London Borough of Sutton. This included BECC, Gold and Silver training, live exercising and loggists training, strengthening preparedness and validating key emergency plans. Year 2 begins in the Autumn, alongside a new multi-agency JESIP exercise designed to enhance joint working and decision-making under pressure.

In Leicester, following our work with the Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland Local Resilience Forum, we delivered a comprehensive multi-agency incident response training programme, strengthening strategic and tactical preparedness and concluding with a series of CPD sessions with strong outcomes.

In Gloucestershire, our Voice of the Child programme has now concluded, having worked with around 300 officers and staff to improve how policing professionals hear, understand, and act on the voices of children. Alongside this, we delivered a Domestic Abuse–Suicide training programme, focusing on investigative quality, trauma-informed practice, and safeguarding decision-making. This work is now being extended through pre-recorded briefings to ensure continued development and long-term impact.

Our partnerships in the Middle East continue to develop. Following the Eid and Ramadan period, we have resumed delivery of the Advanced Interviewing for Crime Investigations course, now in its ninth iteration. These programmes continue to receive exceptionally positive feedback and highlight the strength of our associate delivery teams. We are now exploring additional UK locations for delivery and welcome input from associates on availability and preferences.



To support this breadth of delivery, LPC operates through a hybrid, associate-led model. This combines a core leadership team with a network of highly skilled associates, allowing us to access specialist expertise, scale delivery, and respond quickly to client needs. This approach ensures flexibility, quality, and consistency across all our work.

Frances Plowman, Senior Business Manager, continues to play a key role in supporting the organisation behind the scenes. Her work focuses on coordinating projects, supporting delivery teams, improving internal systems, and maintaining strong relationships with both clients and associates.
